

MESSAGE FROM ARTISTIC DIRECTOR ANDREA BOYD

While explaining why he chose Bilbo Baggins, Gandalf says that he tried to find a Hero but none were available, so he settled on a little Hobbit instead. A well-to-do hobbit with no desire for adventure, danger or anything that might disrupt their comfortable routine. Yet, Bilbo Baggins is swept up in the excitement of dragon-killing and treasure hunting, and in the end it is the Hobbit's kind nature and newfound courage that leads to the adventurer's success.



And yet a solitary Bilbo couldn't possibly defeat the dragon and save the world. That takes a team of people working together, taking risks, caring passionately about the outcome of the fight.

This feels like a metaphor for our creation of *The Hobbit*.

I may have been the first to say "Let's do *The Hobbit*!". And I may have sat alone at my computer trying to adapt an epic story into something we might be able to produce.

But from there, over a hundred people have worked together, overcoming so many challenges - a heatwave, COVID, a story too big for our resources. I have watched this incredible team come together, stretched to the limit, passionately creating our beautiful version of Middle-earth. This community of adventurers has never ceased to inspire me. Through laughter, tears, frustrations, and surprises, they have always rallied to the call of the adventure.

On another note, we worked closely with Middle-earth Enterprises, the Tolkien Estate, and Harpers Publishing to secure the rights and get approval for our final script. A previous draft of the script had several characters with switched genders. Bilbo and Gollum, and others, were female. When I heard from the rights holders that they would not, under any circumstances, approve a change in gender, I was heartbroken. How could it be that in 2022 referring to Bilbo as "she" could be a deal breaker? Yet there it was, but casting women to play male characters was acceptable, so we proceeded in the only way we could, and we are pleased to at least have gender parity in our cast. Please feel free in your imagination to interpret the gender of the characters in any way you like.

There are so many heroes working on this show. Both professional artists and community volunteers have gone above and beyond to bring you this epic adventure, and I am filled with gratitude.

Let's all be heroes.

... or burglars.


Andrea Boyd is a director, playwright and theatre educator. As Artistic Director of Festival Antigonish Summer Theatre, her directing credits include *Robin Hood: The Great Escape, The Goodnight Bird, Stage Kiss, Hope and Gravity, Ben Hur* and *Burnin' Love*. For Theatre Antigonish, she directed *Girls Like That, The Ash Girl, Eurydice*, and *Sunshine on Leith*, among others. She has also directed at The Grand Theatre, Theatre Lac Brome, NotableActs, Keyano Theatre and the University of Alberta.

Writing credits include *Robin Hood: The Great Escape* (with Laura Teasdale), *Hector the Spectre Steals the Show* for Festival Antigonish Radio Theatre, (also with Laura Teasdale), *Angel's River*, produced by Live Bait Theatre, Notable Acts Theatre Company and Sault Community Theatre, *Stalker: The Musical*, with songs by Paul Morgan Donald, (staged reading though Canadian Centre for Theatre Creation); *Molly*, presented in conjunction with the New Works festival at the University of Alberta & Sage Theatre's Ignite Festival; and *Kid Sister*, presented by Found Productions. *For the Love of Gracie Gray* was the recipient of the 2013 Write-On-Q Quebec Playwrighting Competition and received a staging workshop with Live Bait Theatre and a reading with Eastern Front Theatre.

Andrea believes in creating theatre that speaks to the community and that is inclusive; that supports female artists and Canadian artists; and that can bring about transformation by encouraging empathy. She holds an MFA in Directing from the University of Alberta, where she also taught for several years in the drama department. She is from New Brunswick, and has taught and directed across the country, but is delighted to call Antigonish home.




THINGS TO NOTE






THE CREATIVE TEAM





